Constitution of Applewood Women's Golf Club

AWGC Membership

Active Membership

Women may join Applewood Women's Golf Club (AWGC) through written application, payment of annual dues, established handicap and GHIN number. New members may join anytime during the year. Annual dues include the players annual GHIN fee.

To establish a handicap, you must submit the equivalent of 54 holes (3, 18-hole or 6, 9-hole) scorecards from any CGA course. Scorecards must be signed, attested and dated during regular season play and turned into the Handicap chair. Players are asked to establish a handicap by mid-season and are not eligible for weekly prizes or tournament play until they have established a handicap index.

Handicap ONLY

Women may use the Applewood Women's Golf Club to obtain a handicap and GHIN number through CGA, without becoming a member. A charge is made according to the fee levied by CGA.

Weekly Sign-Up



Tee time sign-up sheets are located on the bulletin board in the club room. Sign-up in advance. Tee times are posted on Golf Genius by Sunday night. To cancel or change any tee time, call the Pro Shop no later than Monday night. *Note: Major Tournaments may have a different sign-up format.* Weekly green fees are paid directly to the Pro Shop upon check-in. If there is inclement weather, an official cancellation will be sent via email.

Plays-of-the-Day

See the schedule of events and description for Plays of the Day, later in this booklet. Winners are awarded in each flight. Winnings are posted monthly by the second Tuesday of the following month, and can be redeemed for merchandise in the Pro Shop. It is preferred that awards be redeemed by the end of season; however, any unused will carry over into the following year. All results will be posted in Golf Genius. The club log-in information is on the first page of this booklet. Players can view tee sheets and weekly results, including their weekly hole-by-hole statistics.

Tournaments

There are 3 major tournaments during the season. All include 2 consecutive weeks of play. In order to participate you must meet the following requirements. To qualify for 2 Women Best Ball players must have completed 1 league round of 18 holes. For Lady of the Ringer, completed 4, 18-hole league rounds. And for the Club Championship, 5 full league rounds and/or team rounds must be completed. Tournament winners awarded at the end of the season.

B-Team Matchplay

Interested in a little more competition, want to join our team to play against other clubs? Join the Applewood Women's league B-Team Match team, which plays on select Mondays throughout the season. Scorecards, Pace-of-Play & Etiquette & Two Penny Putts

Score Cards

- One name per score card, except for two-women / team events.
- Score cards must be legible and include your full name. Please print.
- Keep your gross score for each hole and keep track of the number of putts. Hole out or pick-up at 10. Maximum score 10/3.
- Exchange your card with another playing partner. Keep your own score near the bottom of their card to help with any discrepancies.
- All score cards must be signed, dated and attested to before submitting. Leave completed card on the table in the club room.
- If you have any Chip-Ins, Eagles or Birdies be sure to mark and sign the sheet posted on bulletin board.
- Golf Genius is used to manage our plays of the day and major tournaments. Weekly scores will be posted by the tournament committee. Golf Genius will automatically adjust for WHS scoring. Log-in information on page one of this booklet.

Pace-of-Play & Etiquette

- Keep up with the group in front of you.
- Watch drives off the tee box.
- Keep searches for lost balls to 3 mins, and if you can, hit your own ball first, then help others look to keep things moving.
- Leave the green promptly and mark score cards at the next tee box.
- Repair divots and ball marks and replace rakes INSIDE sand traps.
- Mindful to be quiet while others are setting-up or swinging.

2 Penny Putts

Players pay 2 pennies per putt after each round, deposited in the putt pot in the club room. Proceeds go to the best putters for the season.

Applewood Local Rules

Natural Areas

- **Natural Areas (NA)** Defined as any area not mowed or otherwise defined WITHIN the general area of the course, these are treated as red penalty areas. **Out of Bounds: (OB)** is marked with white stakes and are outside the general course area.
- If you and any player in the group are certain the ball went into the NA, do NOT hit a provisional ball.
- All NA can be entered on FOOT hit out of and you may ground your club.
- If you cannot find your ball within 3 minutes, you may drop a ball within a two-club length distance from the point where your original ball crossed the margin of the NA, taking a 1 stroke penalty.

Holes 9 & 14

- The ponds are yellow penalty areas that require you to keep the point of entry between you and the flag when hitting your next ball should the first enter the pond.
- Ball # 1 enters the pond: Hit another ball to attempt to reach across the water, hitting 3. OR carry your ball to the drop area marked across the pond, hitting 4. (1 stroke for physically advancing your ball).
- Ball # 2 enters the pond: You MUST carry your next ball to the drop area hitting 6. [Hit, drop, hit (3) carry, drop, hit = (6)]
- **Hole # 9:** The rocks and cart barn behind the green are (OB) but hard to see. You may hit a provisional ball OR proceed to drop area hitting 4.
- **Hole # 14:** If your ball crosses the water but enters the NA and you do not find it within 3 minutes, proceed to the drop area hitting 3. You may hit out of the NA as explained above.

Tournament Rules

- **Score Cards:** One name clearly printed on top of each card. (Except for 2-Women or Team events.)
- Exchange score cards between players keeping your own score at the bottom of the card for comparison or any discrepancy.
- Score cards must be **dated, signed and attested** before submitting.
- All players play from the Red tees.
- Competitions are on Tuesday with Major Competitions extending for 2 consecutive weeks.
- Handicaps will be valid from the previous week and carry for the entire 2 week competition. Tee times are assigned according to handicaps and flights. Day 2 Tee times are assigned according to results from Day 1.
- Being late for your tee time is penalized according to USGA rules.

Major Tournament Ties

Tournament ties will be broken by recorded scores starting with the most difficult hole (# 18) continuing with decreasingly difficult holes. The tournament committee makes the final decision.

Tournament Results / Awards

- Results of competition will be posted on Golf Genius. Log-in information on first page of this booklet.
- Tournament awards presented at the Fall Awards luncheon.

Plays of the Day Descriptions

Low Net	Your total score minus your course handicap.
Low Gross	Scratch score... your score, without subtracting your handicap.
Closest to the Pin	Closest to the flagstick after two strokes.
Closest to the Line	Drive closest to the line drawn down the middle of the fairway.
Longest Drive	Longest drive within the fairway.
Beat the Champ	All players whose net scores are better than or equal to the net score of the Club Champion are winners.
Blind Draw	Before play starts nine holes are blind drawn and put in an envelope. ONLY those holes drawn will be counted – minus ½ handicap.
Christmas In July	Throw out the score of your 3 worst holes and deduct ½ handicap.
Criers	Player throws out two holes, One on the front 9 and one on the back 9. Subtract full handicap.

Easy Peasy	Total scores of the nine easiest holes on the course based on the scorecard handicap stroke allocation, then subtract ½ handicap. (1,2,3,7,9,10,11,14,17)
Fine Nine	Best 9 holes gross.
Hardest Holes	Total scores of the nine hardest holes on the course based on a scorecard handicap stroke allocation, then subtract ½ handicap. (4,5,6,8,12,13,15,16,18)
Middle Nine	Total only holes #6 thru # 14 minus ½ handicap.
Mutt & Jeff	Total score on par 3's and Par 5's, minus ½ handicap.
ODD-I-TEE	Total your gross score on all ODD holes, minus ½ handicap. (1,3,5,7,9,11,13,15,17)
ONES	Total holes starting with the letters ONES minus ½ handicap. (1,6,7,8,9,11,16,17,18)
Par-4-A-Day	Total your gross scores for all par 4's, minus ½ handicap. (1,3,5,6,8,10,12,13,18)
Salt & Pepper	Post odd holes on the front nine, and even holes on the back nine, minus ½ handicap.
Score Minus Age	Score Easy... your gross score minus your age.
Secret Partner	Two-women teams, except you won't know who your partner is until after play. Net-Best Ball.
Synchronized Swim	Total the score for all holes on the course where your ball could get wet minus ½ handicap. (2,5,7,8,9,10,13,14,18)
T's & F's	Total the net scores on holes that start with T and F. (2,3,4,5,10,12,13,14,15)
Tee to Green	Gross score minus your putts, and deduct ½ handicap.
Three Blind Mice	Before Play starts 3 holes are blind drawn. Each player's score on these 3 holes will be subtracted from their total score – minus handicap.

Awards

Hole-In-One

- A \$3.00 assessment is included in membership dues for holes in one. A hole-in-one prize at Applewood Golf Course during Women's Club functions will be awarded at the end of season, fall awards luncheon.
- If no hole-in-one is made during the season, the funds are used for the benefit of all members.

Chip-Ins / Birdies / Eagles

Members with chip-ins, birdies or eagles should sign the sheet on the bulletin board in the club house indicating the holes on which the shot was made and the date. This sheet must also be signed by a witness. These shots only count on Tuesday play and Major Tournaments. B-Team play does not count. Birdies and eagles will be tracked automatically in Golf Genius.

Best Putter and Season Ringer

Based on the fewest number of putts per round, or lowest putting average for the season. Paid from the proceeds weekly Putt Pot, where players pay 2 pennies per putt after each round, deposited in the jar in the club room. Season Ringer is awarded to the player who wins lowest net to par for the season.

Most Improved

Players must be an active member and have played at least 50% of the season. Calculated based on the player's handicap index at the beginning of the season vs. the end.

World Handicap System 2020 - Posting Procedure

When not playing in our league, players are required to post all 9 and 18-hole scores from March 15th through November 15th in GHIN. The 18-hole slope and rating of the courses can be found on the score card where you played your round. USGA's GHIN application also provides this information and a lookup for all golfers in your foursome. Make sure to note your tee placement.

The 5 Things You Need to Know:

1. Your Handicap Index *may* change. Your new handicap will be more responsive to good scores by averaging your 8 best scores out of your most recent 20.
2. In the new system, your Course Handicap will be the number of strokes needed to play par. Target score for the day is Par plus course handicap.
3. Net Double Bogey. The maximum hole score for each player will be limited to a **NET Double Bogey. Calculation is Par+2+any handicap strokes received.**
4. Handicap Index will be revised daily which will provide a fairer indication of a player's ability at the moment.
5. Safeguards in the new system which will limit extreme upward movement of Handicap Index, automatically and immediately reduce a Handicap Index when an exceptional score of at least 7 strokes better is posted AND will also account for abnormal course or weather conditions to ensure that scores reflect when a course plays significantly different than it's established course and slope rating.

If you have not established a handicap, you can do so by submitting the equivalent of 54 holes (3, 18-hole or 6, 9-hole) scorecards from any CGA course. Scorecards must be signed, attested and dated during regular season play and turned into the Handicap chair.
